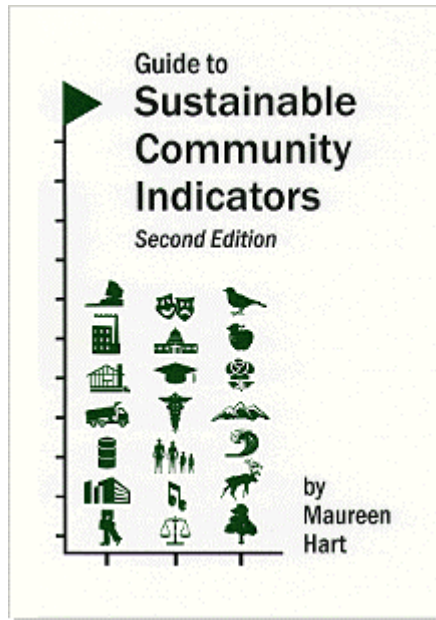

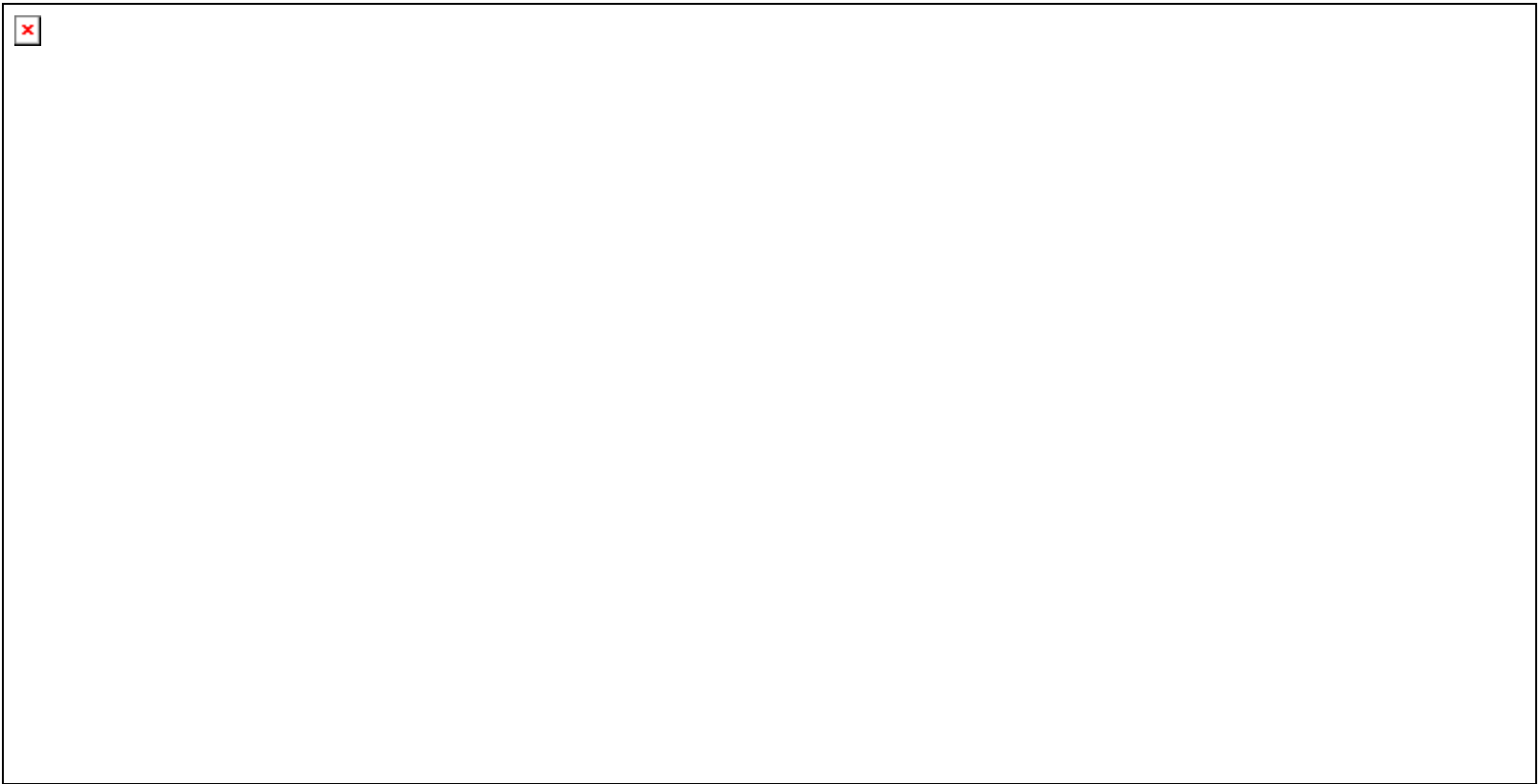

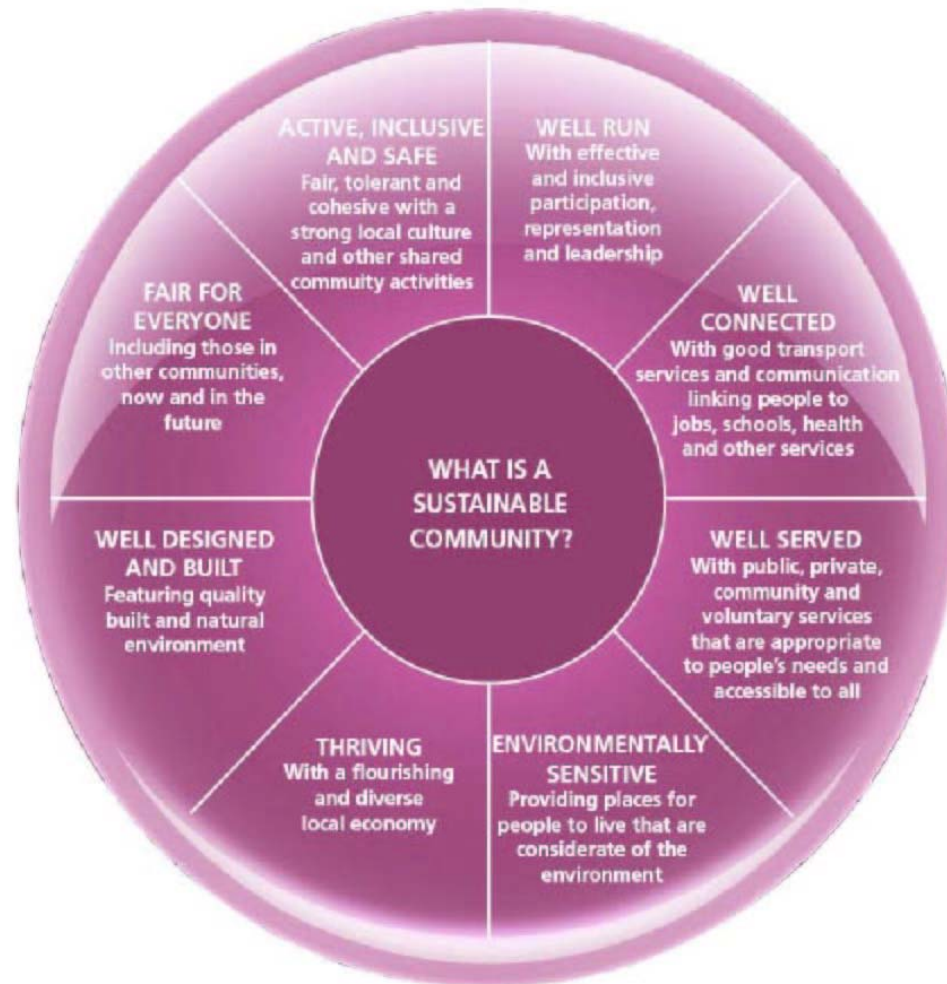

Part II: Agreement to compile Good Practice Case Studies

Case study requirements

1. The social, economic, demographic, and environmental **challenges** and opportunities faced by the place.
2. An **integrated approach** to territorial development, sustainable communities ingredients and integration processes.
3. Efforts to integrate **urban, rural**, and regional dimensions into development strategies.
4. The role of local **leadership** and **services** in promoting the sustainable communities.
5. **Skills** and investment actions (where appropriate).
6. The **successful outcomes** and achievements studying each location.
7. The positive roles that national, regional and local levels of **government**, and the EU have played.

All case studies should be prepared according to the agreed EUKN template.
